STAR

(School Tax Assessment Relief)

Did you buy or build a new home this year?

If so, you will not see a STAR reduction on your school tax bill. Instead, you will see a note on the bill that states that "A STAR check will be mailed to you by the NYS Tax Department".

If you DO NOT see this note you DO NOT have the STAR exemption and need to sign up.



Transfer Station/Trash Service Closure

Dear Residents:

Every year the Town of Pembroke Town Board reviews the cost effectiveness of the Town's transfer station. Over the past several years, the transfer station has seen a steady decline in the amount of residents using it, while the costs to operate and maintain it have steadily increased. As a result, the Town Board has determined that it is no longer in the best interest of the Town to operate the transfer station and will be closing it effective January 1, 2017.

There are several other trash collection companies in the area that you can contact for curbside pickup at your residence.

If you wish to continue to dispose of your trash yourself you can utilize the Genesee ARC transfer station located at 3785 West Main Street Road (across from Kiwanis Park) in the town of Batavia. The Genesee ARC transfer station offers similar recycling and trash collection services as the Town's current transfer station. In addition, it offers additional hours of operation for your convenience. For your reference, enclosed is the information on the Genesee ARC transfer station.

The Town Board understands that there may be residents that have purchased transfer station punch cards that may be unused when the transfer station closes. If you have an unused punch card, please come into the Town Clerk's office during normal business hours to process your reimbursement.

RECYCLING FACTS

- ◆ Half of all polyester carpet manufactured in the US is made from recycled soda bottles.
- ◆ Recycled plastic is also made into plastic lumber, clothing, flower pots, insulation for sleeping bags & ski jackets, car bumpers and more.
 - ◆ Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a TV for three hours -- or the equivalent of a half a gallon of gasoline.
 - ◆ An aluminum can that is thrown away will still be a can 500 years from now!
 - ◆ There is no limit to the amount of times an aluminum can be recycled
 - ◆ If all our newspaper was recycled, we could save about 250,000,000 trees each year!
- ◆ A modern glass bottle would take 4000 years or more to decompose -- and even longer if it's in the landfill.
